# MEMORIAL TROPHIES

**Wyn Saal** was born at Derrinallum in Victoria. She attended school in Geelong and showed a great love of all things art. She also displayed quite a talent for drawing and painting, particularly in watercolour. After the outbreak of the war, she enlisted in the Women's Royal Australian Airforce, thus placing her artistic ambitions on hold. At the conclusion of the war she moved to Queensland with her family. Whilst busy with motherhood she still managed to draw and paint for enjoyment and for her friends' pleasure, as well as being involved in Red Cross and the local Hospital Auxiliary. She was always greatly interested in the talents of local people, and the award in the Art Section is dedicated to her memory by her family to further encourage art within the community.

**Madge Folker** Memorial Trophy is proudly given by Revan and Wendy Folker in memory of Madge's long association with the Millmerran Show. Madge loved creating a variety of handcraft pieces during her years, which her family love having today, and she enjoyed finding new creations to master. Madge entered in many areas of the show over the years and judged the Junior Handicraft Competition which her Great Grandchildren are now entering. The Folker family and descendants continue to be actively involved in the show today.

The Society offers the **Castles Family** Trophy in the Schoolwork Section.

Most of William John and Mary Castle's children supported community organizations in Millmerran and district. Andrew, Herbert, Jim and Bill were active members of many committees in the town and on the Downs. Jim was President of the Show Society for many years. Castles descendants held shares in the Millmerran Dairy Co-op and when the shares had to be sold Edna Lyttle (Castles) asked family members to donate any profit to the Millmerran Show Society.

**Kate Goodson** was born in Melbourne in 1879 and came to Queensland in approx. 1910, with her husband Leonard, who worked on many properties around Eastern Queensland, including Jimbour Station, from where they came to Millmerran in 1926. Kate competed in cooking, sewing and handwork in the shows of the 1926 – 1936 era. She did lovely fine crochet, tatting and even teneriff lace. She left the district but returned in 1954 and competed in knitting until her passing. She was the mother of **Alice Thomson** who was born in 1914 and married Alex Thomson in 1940. Alice competed in the show for many years, in cooking, sewing, knitting and handwork and won many prizes. She was the mother of Clymene Page and Leonard Thomson.

## **Mr. & Mrs Pat Lunney Memorial Trophy**

is presented in memory of Patrick Joseph Lunney and Maud Emily Lunney (nee Hutchinson). This trophy commenced after their passing (Pat in February 1970 and Maud at the end of 1970) Pat worked as a Guard for Queensland Railways. He was:-

- Keen horseman with his leisure time full of horse interests
- Member of the Show Committee, with Ring Master commitments
- Patron and Founding Member of the Millmerran Pony Club
- Member of the Millmerran Race Committee

His love of horses, shows and associated events is continued, as grandchildren / great grandchildren continue to compete, locally and in Northern Queensland. Maud was also a keen supporter of the Pony Club and assisted with catering requirements for many organisations in the district. She was always very willing to assist anyone in need.

The **Pat Lunney** Memorial Shield was introduced into the Pony Club events in 2010, after Pat's passing in November 2009. Pat had been a member of the Show Society and Ring Steward for horse events. Always a keen horseman, founding member of the Pony Club, was a Pony Club instructor and was Patron of the Club at the time of his death. Pat bred and raced racehorses, with success, and was one of the last members of the Millmerran Race Committee.

## **NORAH MOFFATT MEMORIAL TROPHY**

**Mrs. Norah Lucy Moffatt** (nee McCormack) 25.05.1921 - 15.04.1995

This trophy is donated by Col Moffatt in memory of his wife, Norah, in recognition of her support for the family's love of horses and equestrian competition. Her tireless efforts enabled her six children and many of her grandchildren to compete successfully, not only at our local show, but also at the Brisbane Exhibition, on many occasions. Norah was also the inaugural secretary of the Millmerran Pony Club, a position she held for many years.

## **OM MOFFATT PERPETUAL MEMORIAL TROPHY**

**Mrs. Olive May Moffatt** (nee Ferricks) 24.05.1893 - 21.07.1961

This trophy began in 1962 in memory of Olive May Moffatt's expressed wish to introduce a trophy for Champion Girl Rider. She was a very capable horsewoman, inheriting her horse ability and knowledge from her own mother, who competed in hunting events, side-saddle. Her purchase of two 'show ponies' at the Brisbane Exhibition in 1957 set the scene for her grandchildren and great-grandchildren to compete successfully in the show-ring and carry on her love of horses.



### **James Robert (Bob) Anderson (1905 - 1977)**

Bob Anderson was the only son of dairy-farming parents at "Kenmuir", Southbrook, and was raised with a particular interest in breeding both cattle and horses. He married Nancy Farquharson, also of Southbrook, in 1936 and abandoned dairying for sheep and grain-growing when they purchased "Birilli" at Cecil Plains in 1944. With their six children, they moved to "Karriba" along the Millmerran-Goondiwindi road in 1953 and established a herd of Herefords, clearing and cultivating brigalow country to plant both grain crops and winter crops for fattening their cattle for market, something of a novelty in that particular district at the time. Bob regularly showed a pen of fats in the Millmerran and local district Shows, and also the RNA in Brisbane. He had a longstanding association with the Millmerran Show Society.

**John Heckels** was born in Pittsworth in 1941, the elder son of Jack & Rose Heckels who lived on "Moruya" in the Bringalily District. In 1956 Jack & Rose sent John to boarding school in Southport, to broaden his life experiences.

While at Southport, John excelled in sport, especially rowing and football. John was considered a valuable member of the rowing team and was asked to return to the school for a term in 1958. John's proudest achievement at school was winning the Head of the River in 'The Eights', in this year. In 1994, after many years of drought, John had an opportunity to sell the farm and settle in Toowoomba. After a long illness, John died at the age of 66, in 2008.

**Joyce Jones** (nee Storey) lived at "Wyong" in the Bringalily district. She was born and raised in Jandowae and trained as a nurse in Dalby before her marriage to John Jones in 1961. They raised three children and Joyce kept very busy, cooking and sewing for her family and helping on the farm. She particularly enjoyed being involved in the cattle and cultivation work. Joyce was a keen member of the Millmerran District Hospital Auxiliary, volunteered with the Tuckshop at Millmerran State School and helped operate the Bringalily feeder school bus for some years. Joyce passed away in 1992 at the age of 52 and is sadly missed by her family and friends.

### **Iris Millicent Funk**

Iris was the middle child of Albert and Violet Scragg, who ran their property 'Sunny Hill' as a dairy and mixed grain farm. She was a very good student, but due to circumstances was unable to continue her education beyond primary school. In 1950, Iris married Henry Funk and they began their life together as dairy farmers. As well as working long hours on the farm and in the house, she sewed many beautiful dresses for her daughters and their cousins. If no pattern was available, Iris just made it up as she went along, her creative streak guiding her to a special and unique result every time. Membership of the CWA really piqued her interest in handicrafts, and on moving into Millmerran in 1967 was taught to crochet by Mrs. Annie Boardman. This proved to be her main interest, but she also excelled at floral art, paper tole and Brazilian embroidery. She took great interest in her church and revelled in the display which they produced for the annual show. She left a legacy of dozens of prize certificates and many local people as well as family members treasure some of her work, particularly the embroidered and crocheted table linen. Iris passed away in May 2008, leaving her husband Henry, daughters Janelle and Sharyn, two grand-daughters and five great-grandchildren.

**Desmond Brian Muir** was born in Warwick, third child of David & Elsie Muir who lived at Dalveen. He came to Millwood aged eight years, when his parents bought 'Avondale' where they dairy farmed for many years. Des loved sport and played tennis and cricket. He held a great passion for cattle and horses. He broke in a few horses and later turned to bullock riding, competing at local and district Rodeos; reaching the semifinals at Warwick. Later he began fattening cattle, mostly breeding his own. He was very successful in winning many trophies at the Show and topping the market in Toowoomba and Millmerran sale yards. Des was a Life Member of Millmerran Show Society. He passed away in August 2013, leaving his wife Edna, daughters Donna and Karol and three grandchildren.

### **ALEX PATON FAMILY MEMORIAL TROPHY**

#### **Alexander Francis (Alex) Paton 10.04.1902 - 05.01/1980**

Alex was born at Kooroongarra, the eldest son of Hugh and Selina Paton who farmed in that area. In 1926 Alex married Evelyn Kahler in Toowoomba and they started their married life owning and operating the local butchers shop at 'The Garra'. In 1936 Alex and Evelyn, having sold the butchers shop, commenced farming on a small farm at Kooroongarra prior to shifting to a larger property in the Bringalily District, on the Millmerran Inglewood Highway, which they subsequently named 'Warragah'. Initially dairy and pig farmers, Alex changed over to sheep and cropping before changing to his great interest and love, cattle fattening and breeding. He was a highly admired and respected cattle man which led him to build his own saleyards on the property, where monthly cattle sales were held for many years. Alex's profound interest in cattle led to his introducing one of the first Santa Gertrudis Cattle breeding Studs in Australia, on the property in the early 1960's. Annual Paton Santa Gertrudis Stud Sales became a major event in the wider Millmerran area requiring the saleyards and facilities to be extended and upgraded to cater for the many buyers who travelled from throughout Australia. An enthusiastic and devout supporter of all things local, Alex never missed attending the Millmerran Agricultural Show, where the Family were successful exhibitors at this and many Annual Shows, achieving the penultimate accolade in 1974 when one of their Santa Gertrudis Bulls won National Sire of the Year for Australia, over all breeds of cattle. 'Warragah' saleyards were, for many years, the venue for an annual Rodeo, the proceeds from same being donated to many worthwhile projects and causes within the local community, including the Millmerran Show Grounds. Alex and Evelyn had three sons, Evan, Keith and Col, and one daughter, Beryl (McKenzie).

**Lyndon Pfeffer** was born in Millmerran , the eldest son of Clarrie and Sylvia of Pampas.

At age 15, he began his lifetime love of farming before his untimely death in 2019, aged 62 years.

His dedication and community spirit was demonstrated by the number of community organisations in which he was involved, including being the Farm Produce Steward for over 30 years and also a term as Show Society President.

Lyndon's commitment to the wider Grains Industry saw him become involved in the Qld Graingrowers Assoc., which later became part of AgForce. He served as the AgForce Grains Board President from 2005 - 2010 at a state level as well as on National Industry Boards. Lyndon also had an interest in research and development and hosted both winter and summer grain variety trials, a reflection of his interest in trying to farm better. The Lyndon Pfeffer Memorial Shield for Overall Champion Field Wheat Crop is presented by his family.

**Tim Thornton** was born in Warwick, the youngest child of Nick and Ilene Thornton of 'Faltha' Kooroongarra.

Tim was home schooled up to Year 8 and then went to Gatton College for 3 years, after which he returned to the family Property. During 1965 he spent 4 months working at 'Woodonga', the local horse stud. Tim became a Member of the Millmerran Show Society and held the position of President for three years, 1988-1990. His passion was, firstly the Wool Section and later also the Sheep Dog Trials, having been Steward for both. Tim was awarded Life Membership to the Millmerran Show Society. Tim passed away in August 2023.

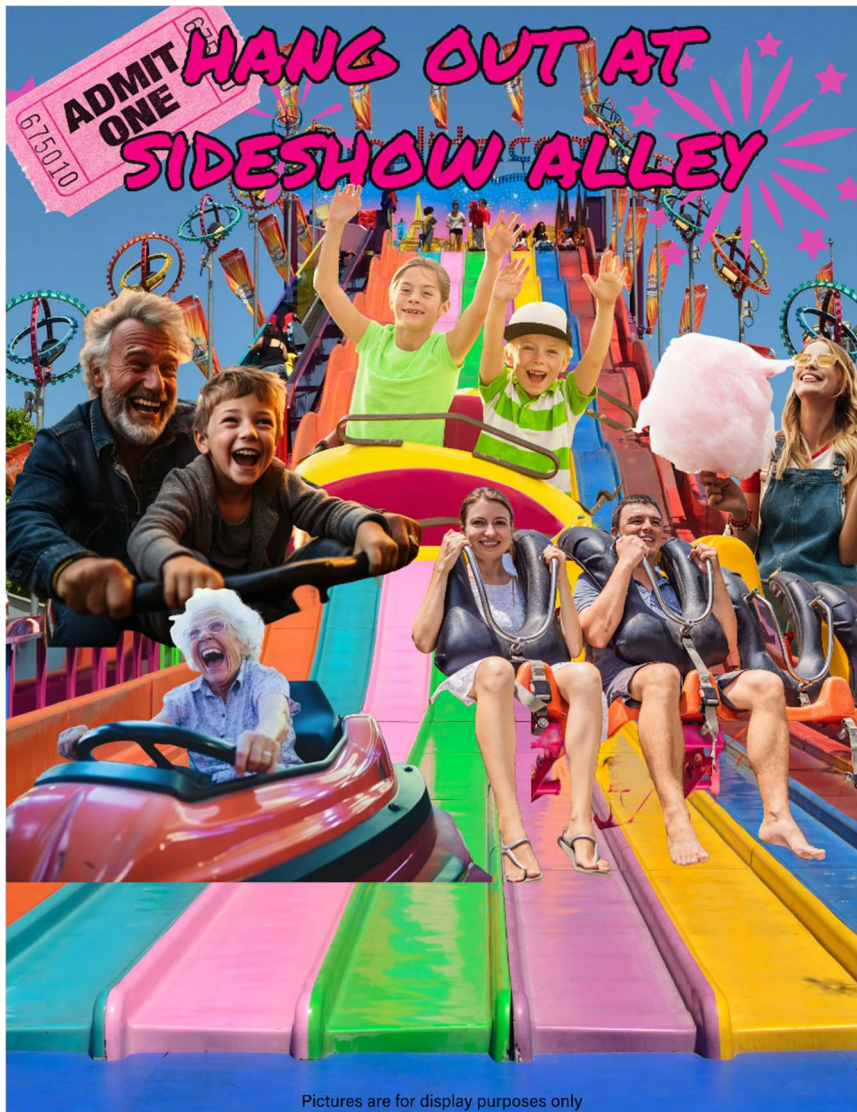

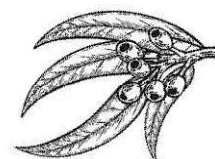

Preheat oven to 180 bake. Grease a 20cm round tin.

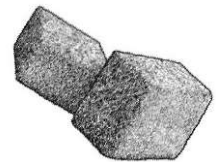

## Oat Cornflake Cookies

1 ¼ cups Plain Flour	1 cup Rolled Oats
1 ½ cups Crushed Cornflakes	¾ cup Caster Sugar
¾ cup Shredded Coconut	150g Butter chopped
2 tbsp Golden Syrup	1 teasp Bi-Carb Soda

Grease and line two large oven trays with baking paper.

Place flour, oats, cornflakes, sugar and coconut in a large bowl. Mix well and make a well in the centre.

Place butter and syrup in a small saucepan over low heat and stir until melted. Remove from heat.

Combine 2 tbsp. boiling water and Bi-Carb Soda in a small jug, then stir into butter mixture.

Add to flour mixture and stir to combine. Place heaped tablespoons of mixture, 3 cm apart, on prepared trays. Slightly flatten with a fork. Bake in a moderately slow oven (160 degrees C) for about 18 - 20 minutes, or until golden. Cool on trays.

## Russian Caramels

60g Butter  
2 tbsp. Golden Syrup  
2 teasp. Vanilla Essence

220g (1 cup) Sugar  
395g. Sweetened Condensed Milk

Prepare a 20cm square cake pan by spraying it lightly with cooking oil and lining it with baking paper, running the paper up two sides so you can use it to lift the caramels out of the pan.

(NB It is recommended to use Canola Spray not Olive Oil, as it might taint the flavour.)

Spray a large saucepan with cooking oil, then add the butter, golden syrup, sugar and condensed milk. Bring to boiling point over a medium heat, stirring constantly with a wooden spoon. Turn the heat down to low and stir constantly. Continue to cook at a fast simmer for 10 - 15 minutes, or until a golden caramel colour.

Remove the caramel mixture from the heat and let it cool a little, then add the vanilla. Beat until thick and smooth.

Pour the caramel into the prepared pan and shake the pan gently from side to side to help the mixture settle out smoothly and evenly. Leave at room temperature to cool.

When cold, use a sharp knife to cut the caramel into squares, about 3cm across. Store the caramels in the fridge, in an airtight container, lined with a paper towel.

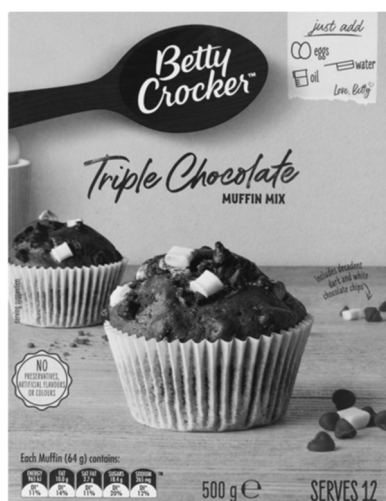

## **Tips for entering produce in Show**

- **Presentation plays a big part in competition**
- Wipe exhibits clean. A polish with a soft cloth helps improve appearance of melons, pumpkins etc
- Try to pick exhibits without any skin blemishes
- Where an entry requires more than one piece of fruit/vegetable keep all pieces to a similar size and shape. It is better to have two smaller even sized and coloured specimens than two uneven large ones.
- Shallot roots can be trimmed neatly to improve appearance. Rhubarb leaves maybe trimmed if wished. Both can be tied together with string or rubber band to help stand neatly in their bottles of water.
- Sweet corn should have the husk left on for judging.
- Pumpkins/squash look best with a trimmed short stalk/stem of approx. 3-5 cms.
- Stewards are happy to answer any of your questions prior to the show.

- 1 Exhibits must be from the 2024/25 clip.
- 2 All Fleece must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor.
- 3 Owners of registered Merino Studs are not eligible for entry.
- 4 Judges will transfer any Fleece to the Class to which, in their opinion, it rightfully belongs
- 5 If, in the opinion of the Judge, a Fleece is overgrown for its type, it will be disqualified
- 6 If, in the opinion of the Judge, a Fleece is not made up of Wool from the one Sheep, all Fleece from that Exhibitor will be disqualified
- 7 Wool not to be removed before 4 pm on Sunday 2 March 2025 and not without payment of entry fees and permission from the Steward
- 8 Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations also apply to this Section
- 9 A judge will be appointed by the Brisbane Wool Selling Brokers' Assn.
- 10 Fleece from a property where a Merino Stud is conducted are not eligible for entry.
- 11 **N.B.** Under **NO** circumstances will **BLACK or COLOURED WOOL** be allowed in the pavilion.

## **SCALE OF POINTS FOR JUDGING** ✍

1. Trueness of Type	10pts	Possessing the most desirable characteristics of the Breed and taking into account Environmental conditions and area in which the Wool is grown.
2. Conformity of Length	10pts	The desired uniformity of Length throughout the entire fleece as it stands.
3. Soundness	10pts	Sufficient Tensile Strength to give the best results under the combing system.
4. Handle	8pts	The Softness and Pliancy necessary for outstanding results in spinning.
5. Colour or Bloom etc	6pts	The possession of those Characteristics for Top Grading from a Style point of view.
6. Character & Style	10pts	Even and well-defined Crimp from Butt to Tip.
7. Density	6pts	Compactness of Growth, Bulk and Breadth of Staple.
8. Evenness	10pts	The regularity of Count
9. Clean Fleece Weight	30pts	Actual Clean

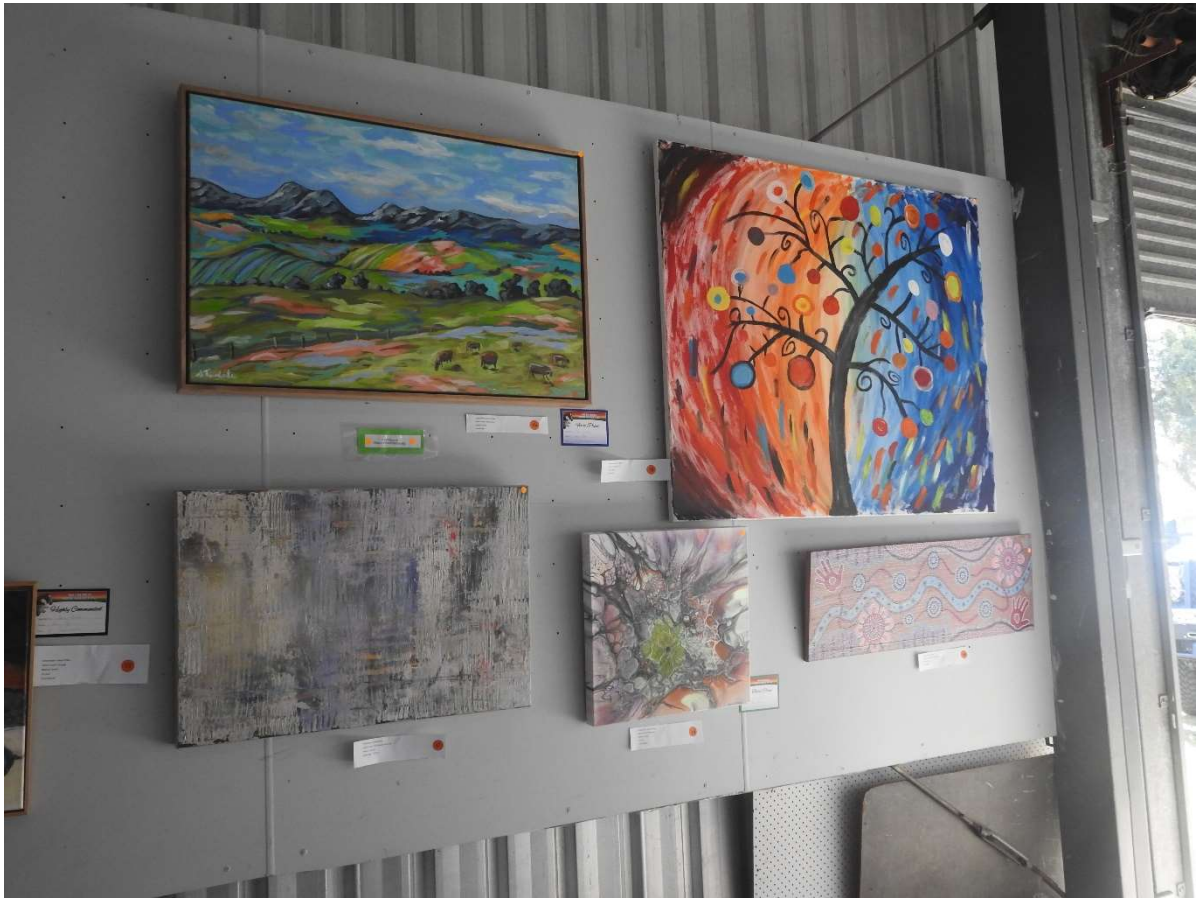

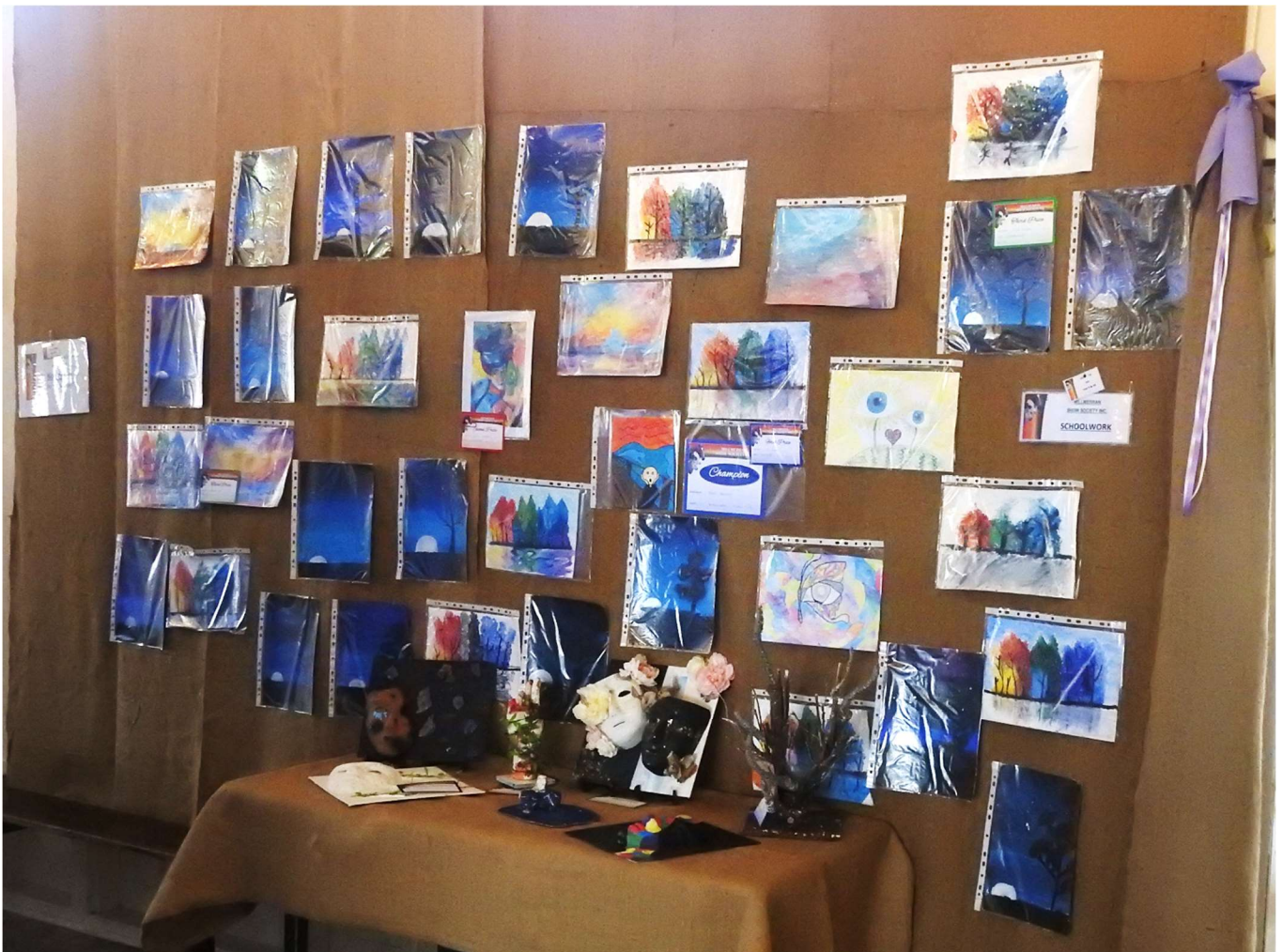

# SHOW SOCIETY REGULATIONS

The attention of intending Exhibitors is drawn to the fact that Entries are accepted subject to the Rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and to the Constitution and Rules of this Society.

- 1 Subject to the Committee's approval, the Judges in all cases shall have the right to award Special Prizes (although not specified in the Prize Schedule) if they consider Special Exhibits merit such recognition, and they may withhold awarding a Prize if the Exhibit is considered unworthy. In the event of there being only one Entry in any Class, the Judge may, at his discretion, issue a First Prize Ticket, but unless otherwise stated, where the First Prize exceeds 50cents, no Association money shall be paid unless the Judge especially certifies the Exhibit to be of exceptional excellence.
- 2 **Ticket Holders, on presentation of their Tickets, will be admitted to the Grounds. Non Ticket Holders will be charged Daily Admission Fee -Adults \$15, Age Pensioners \$10, High School Students 12 Yrs & over (with ID) \$10, Primary School Students 11 Yrs & under Free. Weekend Admission - Adults \$20, Age Pensioners \$15, High School Students 12 Yrs & over (with ID) \$15, Primary School Students 11 Yrs & under Free**
- 3 **Payment of Tickets - Membership: \$30.00 (2 Adults or 2 Adults & Children up to 16 years), Single Adult (no children) \$15.00, Age Pensioners (2 Adults) \$20.00, Single Age Pensioner \$10.00, (Students over 16 years are single Adult); per annum, grants Admission to the Grounds on both days of the Show. Pre Purchased : Adults \$15, Age Pensioners \$10, High School Students 12 Yrs & over (with ID) \$10, Primary School Students 11 Yrs & under Free, grants Admission to the Grounds on both days of the Show.**
- 4 **Payment of Membership gives the right to nominate a fellow Member for election to the Committee or to be in person nominated to such position, enabling the right to vote at meetings.**
- 5 **Entry Fees are 10% of the First Prize Money, except where otherwise stated. All Fees to be included with Entries.**
- 6 No Stock shall be allowed to come before a Judge bearing any Ribbon, Badge or Mark.
- 7 Exhibits in all Sections must be grown or manufactured by or be the work of the Exhibitor, or must be Bona fide Property of the Exhibitor. The Committee shall be entitled to require a declaration of ownership in any case they may think fit.
- 8 All persons in charge of Exhibits will be subject to the direction of the Stewards on the several departments of the Exhibition with reference to placing and removal of their Exhibits and taking part in the Parades. The Stewards have power to disqualify. Exhibitors must display their own Exhibits.
- 9 **On no consideration will any Exhibit be allowed to be removed or taken away until 4.00 pm on the second day of the Show or removed without permission of the Steward in charge, and it shall be a condition of entry that each Exhibitor shall hold the Association harmless and indemnified against legal proceedings arising from any loss, damage, accident, or any cause whatsoever to the Exhibits while on the Grounds.**
- 10 No Pass shall be issued to any Exhibitor.
- 11 All Pavilion Exhibits to be in position by time stipulated in Schedule for each Section.
- 12 Exhibits in collection shall not be eligible to compete separately except where specially mentioned.
- 13 The Stewards may transfer Exhibits entered in the wrong Class to the correct Class, but are unable to interfere with Judges Decision.
- 14 **Prize Money not claimed within One Week of the Date of the Show will revert to the Funds of the Society.**
- 15 Exhibits in Schoolwork Section to be Work done during the School Year 2023/2024 and under the supervision of a School Teacher.
- 16 Any Exhibitor using obscene or abusive language to be disqualified.
- 17 Any Exhibitor cruelly ill-treating any Exhibit to be disqualified.
- 18 Any NOT capable or competent Exhibitor to be removed by Steward
- 19 Exhibits must bear Tickets showing Class, Section and Number, but no name visibly attached.
- 20 Grand Parade at 1.00 pm on the Second Day of the Show. All stock judged and unjudged to take part in the Grand Parade.
- 21 All Entries to be on Association's Printed Forms.
- 22 All Exhibits in Ring Events must conform to the Printed Time Schedules, otherwise they will be disqualified.
- 23 No Collectors will be allowed on the Grounds excepting those Authorised by the Committee, and any Person infringing this Regulation may be removed by any Member of the Committee, with or without the assistance of the Police.
- 24 Showmen's Guild Personnel are not allowed to use loudspeakers or make any other unseemly noise that interferes with the broadcasting from the Ring.
